1. Are you a registered Democrat? If so, how long have you been registered as a Democrat? Have you ever been registered with another party and if so, when and for how long?

Yes. Been a registered Democrat since I moved to California in 1996. Previously, I lived in Illinois, where we did not register by party, but I voted only in the Democratic Primary while living there.

2. Are you a member of the East Bay Stonewall Democratic Club? If so, for how long? If not, have you participated in club activities, supported or contributed to the Club in some other way? I marched with Stonewall in the Oakland Pride Parade in 2014 and have attended the Oakland Pride breakfast numerous times. I served many years as President/Co-President of the City of Alameda Democratic Club. I also serve on the Alameda County Democratic Central Committee.

3. Using specific examples, please identify the causes you have advocated for and the ways you have helped advance LGBT rights or otherwise helped foster a community of inclusivity for LGBT individuals and families.

As Assemblymember Bonta's District Director, I was honored to speak at the City of Oakland's press conference celebrating the Supreme Court's decision in *Hollingsworth v. Perry*, bringing marriage equality to California. I arranged for the City of Alameda to fly the rainbow flag at City Hall on the day the decision was announced. In Alameda, we adopted the "Everyone Belongs Here" campaign – this has become our unofficial motto. On the council, I co-authored a referral with Vice Mayor Malia Vella to increase the reporting to City Council of hate crimes, bringing more visibility to these incidents.

- 6. What do you hope to accomplish if you are elected? Please outline your top three policy goals or objectives and how you intend to achieve them.

## Vision/Priorities

- 1) 911 Fire, Police and Emergency Medical Services: Alamedans who need help, should get it fast. Alameda Hospital must continue to stay open.
- 2) Traffic! We must reduce traffic congestion for our quality of life.
