In my time with the East Bay Young Democrats, the Latine Young Democrats of the East Bay, and Berkeley Councilmember Terry Taplin, I have participated in various East Bay Stonewall Democratic Club activities such as co-hosting social hours, attending the annual Transgender Awareness Month fundraisers, and sharing club statements on club and personal socials. In addition to EBYD, LYDEB, and EBSDC, I am also a

member of the Sierra Club.

Using specific examples, please identify the causes you have advocated for and the ways you have helped advance LGBTQ+ rights or otherwise helped foster a community of inclusivity for LGBTQ+ individuals and families.

As an EBYD board member and club president, I helped mobilize support for the Port Bar to combat discriminatory treatment at the hands of the building owner. In Councilmember Taplin's office, we supported the Port Bar after its windows were shot and during National Coming Out Day, all of which I helped communication in office and club communications to spread the word. I also helped author and pass the City of Berkeley's Transgender Remembrance Resolution and organized the first raising of the Trans flag in the city's history. I worked alongside a coalition that includes OPEN, PLAC, and the office of Councilmember Ramachandran to introduce the first family and relationship structure non-discrimination ordinances on the West Coast in Berkeley and Oakland. In former Richmond Mayor Tom Butt's office, I helped organize the annual Transgender and Pride flag raising ceremonies and author the accompanying resolutions.

I will maximize and leverage the resources of the city and region to deepen Berkeley's investment in affordable housing and homelessness response and move forward key innovative housing justice solutions. I will invest in mobility-inclusive and transit-friendly infrastructure to ensure safe, reliable, and accessible commutes for LGBTQ cyclists, pedestrians, and transit riders, especially low-income community members of color.

What makes you uniquely qualified for the office and how are you different or unique from the other candidates in your race?

As a Mexican immigrant, first-generation college graduate, renter, and transit rider, I have lived experience of both the successes and failures of public policy. I have spent the entirety of my working life fighting for marginalized communities as well as the ideals of this club and our democratic community. I have built coalitions and led community processes involving diverse stakeholders with varying viewpoints to pass major public policies with unanimous support. Through depth of experience, intimate knowledge of Central Berkeley and Downtown's challenges, and my strong ties to their constituencies, I am uniquely positioned to bring the leadership and representation that District 4 and the City of Berkeley deserve.
